that serves all needy families within Garland County and all needy families living in Saline Country around Hot Springs Village. In 2009, our church obtained its 501(c)3 non-profit certificate from the US Internal Revenue Service and the rest is history.

Many local churches send volunteers to assist our community food giveaways, which we hold twice monthly. They also, along with other businesses in our community, support our pantry financially. The Jessieville School District is instrumental each year in doing a cereal drive for our pantry. Brookshire's Grocery, across from

the West Gate of the Village, supports us in a huge way especially during the holiday seasons. Three times a week, our cargo truck picks up food from the Walmart stores on Central Avenue and Albert Pike in Hot Springs. We do the same with the HSV Walmart store as well as Sam's Club in Hot Springs. These

The Faith Fellowship Church Food Pantry regularly supports our local Teen Challenge Men's Campus on Highway 7. Three times weekly, we deliver them fresh produce and fresh fruit to them, along with bread, pastries, and other food items. **2021 YEAR IN REVIEW:** 

- The Faith Fellowship Church Food Pantry **served 17,374 families** in the year 2021
- **120,000 lbs of food** was ordered from the Arkansas Food Bank in 2021
- 23,311 lbs of food was ordered from the Project Hope Food Bank in Hot Springs in 2021
- 5,900 lbs of donated food items from individuals and local community organizations
- 4,800 lbs of donated food from Brookshire's Grocery Company

Along with all the donated food, our pantry spent \$18,193,00 on food purchases in 2021!

## A Note from Executive Director Kim Harrison



Last Fall we were able to grant nearly \$19,000 to 17 local organizations through the Giving Tree grant cycle. In total, Hot Springs Village Community Foundation granted over

\$60,000 the last six months of 2021. These grants included those from organizations' endowments- to help with their operations, individuals granting to their favorite causes, and grants awarded by our local board of directors.

We had a wonderful grants reception in the fall with Governor Huckabee commenting on the importance of generosity in our lives and how it helps us improve our own outlook as well as that of the ones we help. The organizations that were recipients of the grants each told us about the work they do and how the grant funds would be used. The board is currently in the process of developing a new strategic plan to help us map out the next three years. This exercise will keep us busy for the next few months. When it's complete, we will let you know our plans for the future.

Through Hot Springs Village Community Foundation, our community is a better place to live. ## The seeds of children's dreams are often found in books

*Last fall, the Imagination Library of the Ouachitas was a recipient of a Giving Tree grant.* THOSE FUNDS WILL PROVIDE A BOOK EACH MONTH TO 400 CHILDREN IN THE AREA!



Dolly Parton created the Imagination Library to foster a love of reading among preschool children and their families, regardless of income. The mission of Dolly Parton's Imagination Library is to:

- **PROVIDE** for children through age 5 to receive a wonderful, highquality, age-appropriate free book every month in the mail;
- MOTIVATE young children to read books, talk about books and dream more;
- CAPITALIZE on the brain development that occurs in children younger than 5 years of age;
- STIMULATE children's learning of vocabulary, thinking skills and literacy before kindergarten;
- HELP prepare young children for success in school and beyond.

These efforts have had good results in registered children's kindergarten assessments and have lowered the number of retentions in kindergarten through grade three.



Imagination Library of the Ouachitas is our local affiliate of Dolly Parton's Imagination Library. Over the past few years, they have collaborated with CHI St. Vincent to register newborns. The local affiliate also works with local schools, preschools and daycares to register young children.

Currently books for over 4,000 children in Garland, Montgomery, and Pike counties are funded by Imagination Library. It raises funds to pay \$2.08 per book–currently a total of over \$100,000 per year. This is accomplished through local, private donors, and grants. As a result, kindergarten readiness has improved and reading scores are improving in our area.
