ARIL respectfully requests \$2,520 to promote parental involvement, literacy, and education to children, ages 0 to 5, in Faulkner County. We will utilize requested funds, along with the 50% cost-matching grant from ARIL, to sustain and grow enrollment numbers, and provide 2,400 books to at least 200 children in Faulkner County. ARIL will partner with local Head Start and CAPCA early childhood centers to increase enrollment of Hispanic children. 100% of the requested grant will be used to purchase and mail books. Child Care Aware would like to strengthen the kindergarten readiness skills of our 3 and 4 year old children in these two focus areas: Social-Emotional Competencies and Early Literacy. It is well established that the foundations of kindergarten readiness happens within the quality preschool classroom. Our ask for this grant is to address the social-emotional competencies of managing feelings, self regulation, kindness and problem solving foundations and addressing emergent literacy concepts. Before a child's brain can be ready to learn there are basic concepts that must be in place. With this course and materials we will give classroom teachers the tools they need to teach the children how to manage feelings, learn self-regulation, respect for others and kindness for all things. Once these foundational competencies are in place, then the concepts of literacy, math, science, etc. can follow. For this project we will be partnering with Arkansas PBS to use their Little Children, Big Challenges social-emotional materials along with the Muttigrees curriculum that teaches acceptance, respect and kindness. Muttigrees was developed by Yale University and is recognized globally. We are also using the AR Kindergarten readiness component looking at language and emergent literacy and we will be using these tools as well to pull together a comprehensive unit for our terchers to use in the classroom. | Cara McCollum's Birthday Book Project (Faulkner County) | The Cara McColllum Birthday Book Project is an independent non-profit organization providing books to 15,000 Arkansas children, ages 4 – 11, on their birthdays.
