Arkansas Women's Outreach	\$750.00	Funds provided for this grant will be exclusively used to provide period packs to our partners in Faulkner County. At the cost of \$3 each, each pack includes eight tampons, eight sanitary napkins, eight pantyliners, and wipes in a zip closure, water-resistant bag. The goal is for the period pack to be enough to comfortably meet a menstruator's needs for an entire cycle and protect their dignity for another month. Every dollar of grant funding will be used for products.

Renewal Ranch	\$750.00	Every week, Renewal Ranch prepares and serves more than 921 meals for men in the Renewal Ranch program and 100 meals for their families attending each Saturday Chapel Lunch. We utilize proper refrigerators, freezers, ovens, and dishwashers every day for our safe food goals. But we currently need several insulated holding cabinets for cooked food to properly maintain temperatures for our safe food goals: no unsafe food! Prepared food must maintain a temperature of 145 degrees to be safe, as required by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration. At Renewal Ranch, we follow our safe food procedures. If we are able to keep cooked food at a temperature of 145 degrees for no more than four hours, the food is safe to be cooled to a temperature below 40 degrees and reheated at a later time. For prepared food needing to be heated at 145 degrees more than four hours, we are able to reheat the food past a temp of 165 degrees to continue serving it, or we are able to cool the food below a temperature of 40 degrees to reheat at a later time. Without the ability to hold foods at a temperature of 145 degrees, there is the possibility of bacteria growing at a harmful rate that can potentially result in those consuming the food becoming sick. Missed work or medical bills can contribute to a worsening financial situation for a household. There is also the chance of an increase of food waste since any unsafe food must be thrown away and food costs increase unnecessarily. Acquiring additional safe food equipment, specifically an Avantco HPI-1836 insulated holding/proofing cabinet, will help us meet this essential goal of always providing safe food. It will allow Renewal Ranch to prepare meals for program

DCA Productions is made up of professional performers and has had over 60 years experience in developing productions that ignite children's imaginations while reinforcing educational curriculum. "CatKid" brings to its audience curriculum connections in communication, language arts and music. We believe it broadens the students experiences developing the themes of teamwork, friendship and imagination among others. Teachers are given study guides that they can incorporate into the classroom before the performance. This preparation helps ensure a valuable student experience. We are asking for ticket support for 100 students. Our goal is to ensure that no child is excluded due to lack of funds. We also propose giving each school a 4book set of "CatKid Comic Club". These books are recommended for first through 3rd grade readers but are enjoyed by students through grade school. There will be two performances specific to students and an evening performance for families. We anticipate approximately 1800 students will attend the day time performances while more will come with their families in the evening. These performances are held during school hours so that students can be brought by bus on a field trip. In the past, we have had students come to a performance from as far away as Marvel. We always alert school administrators and teachers about upcoming productions. We will do this through social media and other communication avenues.

We believe that Main Stage Education Series is one of the many Conway community assets that influence a child's ability to learn and grow. Many students who attend a Main Stage performance have never been to a live theatre performance. They go away awed. "CatKid" is one of our offering for Fall 2023 that, we believe, will enrich and enhance the audience's education.

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
